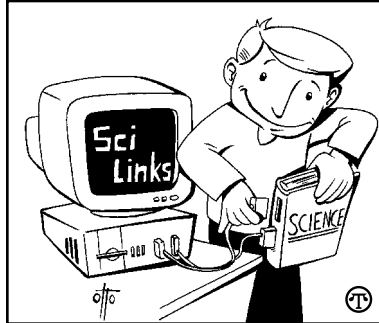


Learning Via The Web
